Electric Pumps to support infrastructure projects and expand our electric pump inventory. These pumps will be used to drastically reduce diesel usage by using either line power, or natural gas generators to provide the power to the pumps. They will have the ability to be run full autonomously with LightspeedTM.




Impact of Linear Recycling

Staying cost competitive, we make it an economical decision for our customers to keep plastic






Electric pumps were a new addition to our 2021 pumping fleet. Both highly efficient and fueled by natural gas generators, fuel usage is lowered further.
















INDIGENOUS ENGAGEMENT
